THE HISTORY OF THE MACHRIE

A Brief History

The Machrie Hotel and Golf Links has a long and interesting history on this remote and beautiful Hebridean island. The word 'machrie' is a corruption of the Scottish Gaelic machair, which means 'fertile, low-lying land', more or less the same as "links" does on the east coast of Scotland.

The farm at the Machrie was developed in the 1800s and the farmhouse was completed late in the decade before golf at The Machrie was thought about.

The course was designed by Willie Campbell in 1891 and was intentionally made long, at least by 19th century standards, to attract golfers to

Islay. Set on the dunes of Islay, Queen of the Hebrides, The Machrie Links course is one of the most beautiful locations in the world of golf. The links turf on which the course sits is among the finest in Scotland. Its dramatic setting on the sand dunes overlooking Laggan Bay and the Atlantic Ocean has few equals.

In 1901, The Machrie Links hosted a famous match between James Braid, John Henry Taylor and Harry Vardon for a prize of £100, reputed to be the largest prize of its kind at that time in the British Isles. Harry Vardon called Mount Zion, now the 17th hole (but originally the first hole), "the hardest hole I have seen". The

links later hosted the Western Isles Open Championship in June 1935.

A few months after the opening of the Machrie golf course, John Ramsay of Kildalton saw the potential and decided to convert the farmhouse to a guest house for the golfers.

By 1913 the popularity of the Machrie Links had reached a peak. The club had more than 200 members and the owners had made a success of the Machrie Hotel. The future looked good in all directions but events in Europe were about to change the outlook completely.

In 1948 the hotel, farm and course were bought by Bert Marshall from Blackpool, a down-to-earth character who reputedly arrived from

Blackpool after a substantial win on the pools.

From 1970 through to 2010 the property changed hands several times and the fortunes of the hotel ebbed and flowed.

In 2011, the Davies family purchased the hotel and undertook a visionary upgrade of the golf course working with D J Russell, the former European Ryder Cup Vice Captain and PGA tour player. D J was tasked with retaining the magical uniqueness of the historic links, but adding some new contemporary twists and challenges.

Since reopening in 2018, the golf course has accumulated accolades and positive recognition as one of Scotland's hidden golf gems and finest links courses.

The family had an equally ambitious plan for the hotel, which was somewhat rundown. While retaining the historic facades, they wanted to create a modern hotel that was cosy and welcoming, but that showcased an eclectic mix of furniture, art work and 'wow' factor design elements.

Floor to ceiling windows showcasing the magnificent views and fun and thoughtful paintings are much talked about and the hotel continues to evolve as a truly welcoming Hebridean hospitality experience.

The Machrie Links

Golf has been played at The Machrie since 1891. Designed by Willie Campbell and more recently modernised by course architect DJ Russell, The Machrie combines the very best of a traditional, historic links course from a previous age, with some contemporary design features. The need for thought, imagination and creative shot-making has not changed throughout the years and carries as much of a premium over sheer power now, as it did then, in 1891.

Golf at The Machrie offers enjoyment and a challenge for golfers of all abilities and age and along with the stunning 18-hole Links, we also have the Wee course,

which offers six par-3 holes which can be played from a multitude of tees. We also have an all-weather 5-bay driving range, short game area and the spectacular Hebrides putting course. Plus an indoor golf studio which includes a Trackman Golf Simulator.

Pro Shop

From equipment to clothing, our golf shop stocks a wide variety of products featuring the very latest in technology from leading brands. We stock some old favourites and bring in a taste of something new.

The Pro Shop is the focal point for all golfing queries and requirements, including the 18-hole Links course, Driving Range, Wee course (6-hole par three course), Hebrides putting course, buggy, trolley and club hire. The Golf Shop is a key part of the Machrie Links golfing experience with knowledgeable staff at hand to assist every guest.

Our resident Golf Professionals have an excellent reputation for getting the very best out of every golfer, providing expert tuition using state of

the art technology, including Trackman – guests should get in touch with the Pro Shop to enquire.

The Driving Range is situated a short walk to the north of the hotel and provides an outside and covered hitting area for golfers and hotel guests to practice their game. Range balls are dispensed at the range and tokens can be purchased from the Pro Shop. It also hosts the '1891' Lounge – where golfers can relax before or after their game. This area is not serviced.

Caddies can be booked through the Pro Shop and while we cannot guarantee availability, every effort will be made to fulfil requests.

All golfers are required to check into the Pro Shop prior to playing the Links or accessing the Wee Course.

Tuition & Coaching

The Machrie's resident PGA Golf Professional, David Foley, is available to provide tuition to all levels of golfer.

A selection of tuition packages are available and can be tailored to suit any golfer, regardless of age or ability. These range from introductory, suitable for complete beginners, to those playing at an advanced level.

Use of our exceptional short game area, indoor teaching

facility can ensure that every aspect of your game is catered for using state-of-the-art technology, including Trackman.

We advise that all lessons or programmes are booked in advance to avoid disappointment.

The Wee Course

The Wee Course has a combination of numerous par three holes to challenge the player, providing four different score card layouts.

The Wee Course is the little brother to The Machrie Links and has many of the subtleties that are encountered on the 18-hole Links. A great place to warm up or refine the scoring part of your game.

Sheets & Towels

In order to save water, your bedsheets and towels will be replaced every third day of your stay.

You may of course request fresh sheets at any time by calling Reception or placing on your bed the green leaf card that hangs on your bathroom door.

If you would like your towels to be changed, please leave them in the bath or shower.

Refuse Sorting & Recycling

Our refuse is sorted in various disposal bins that are destined for recycling and composting.

We make our own compost on-site for use around the links.

Plastic

We try as hard as we can to reduce or eliminate the use of single-use, non-recyclable or non-biodegradable plastics.

All our bin liners – whether in your room or in the kitchens – are biodegradable.

Drinking straws are made of biodegradable cornstarch.

The drinking water we serve is pure Islay water that we UV-light filter on site and bottle in glass. We hence eliminate the disposal of over 10,000 bottles of plastic a year and offer you cleaner, safer water to drink.
