#### GAME FOR IT

#### National Galleries finds hidden Van Gogh painting

A self-portrait by Vincent van Gogh has been discovered in Scotland using x-rays. Conservators scanned the artist's 1885 painting, *Head of a Peasant Woman*, ahead of it going on show at the Royal Scottish Academy in Edinburgh. They found a hidden self-portrait by the painter on the other side of the canvas, buried beneath layers of cardboard. The painting entered the National Galleries of Scotland in 1960, as part of a gift from an Edinburgh lawyer, Alexander Maitland. www.nationalgalleries.org
