SAVE YOUR GRIPS

You'll be amazed at what a little TLC can do for your clubs

id you know
Golf Pride once
conducted a
study that
revealed a set of worn,
two-year-old grips can
cost between three to four
strokes, on average, over the
course of one round? That's
a heck of a lot of shots for
any golfer, which is why
it's so important to look
after your grips. This stepby-step guide from Golf
Pride will help...

1. When your grips wear down, they'll feel slick and lose traction.

As a general rule, it's recommended that you change your grips once a year, though if you play more than 40 rounds a year or hit the range a few times a week, you may need to replace your grips more

2. Pay particularly close attention to the clubs you use most frequently. The chances are you'll need to replace the grips on your wedges a lot sooner than your long irons or woods. It may be that you only need to get four clubs regripped at your local pro shop.

3. A full bag of 14 clubs can be cleaned and dried in less than 15 minutes.

All you need is a warm, soapy brush or sponge so you can scrub each grip clean from top to bottom. Just don't forget to rinse each grip after with warm, non-soapy water to remove any residue. Leftover soap can leave the rubber feeling slick.

4. Pat each grip dry with a clean towel and set aside to air dry to preserve that tacky

feel. We recommend that you clean your grips once every five to 10 rounds to remove a build-up of sweat, dirt and oils from your hands.

> 5. Store your golf clubs at room temperature, ideally in the house, rather than in your car boot, shed or

garage. Your partner may not appreciate it, but your grips certainly will!
